# WELCOME to our latest newsletter Galliard catalyst

### **DEAR NEIGHBOUR**

I am pleased to say that following on from our last newsletter, we are well underway with the construction and have so far made good progress.

The concrete frame is now completed on the first block on Plough Way (see the progress pictures on the side of this newsletter). The scaffold has now been erected around the building, and we are currently installing both the weatherboard and window, with brickwork due to follow shortly.

The concrete frame for largest on the project is now well above ground, and we hope to have this complete May 2020.

Over the next three months we will begin to carry out the internal fit out of the first block. We will be using local material suppliers as much as possible in order to help reduce the amount of deliveries to site.

Furthermore, both Galliard and Catalyst are keen to meet with local stakeholders and neighbours so that you can stay informed and up-to-date with the project. # YOUNG LEADERS FOR CHANGE



Catalyst recently organised for 11 young people from London to attend a team building residential trip to the Lake District to develop the next phase of its Connecting Ambitious Leaders Movement (CALM) programme.

Developed and co-funded with fellow housing association Hyde, CALM is a youth movement that works with and for at risk young people in London. The programme is designed to improve community cohesion by influencing funders and stakeholders to improve opportunities for their community and future generations.

The programme has been able to deliver meaningful participation with at risk young people, building pathways to tailored support, including early intervention through to employment. The project has helped young people speak up, be heard and get involved in improving their neighbourhood.
