### Dear Neighbours

As we are sure you have noticed, there has recently been some activity on the former Greyhound Track on Plough Lane. The demolition contractors 777 have been preparing the site for the demolition works. We want to tell you a little bit more about what has been happening and what is going to happen on the site over the next month.

The scheme officially received planning consent in December 2017. This consent provides permission for just over 600 new homes which include both private and shared ownership homes, as well as the new Football Stadium for AFC Wimbledon.

Following the final agreement with Merton, Galliard Homes entered into a joint venture arrangement with Catalyst Housing to deliver this scheme, this partnership will enable more shared ownership units to be provided. This partnership between the two companies is called Merton Catalyst LLP and it will be responsible for the development this project.

As part of the planning permission, once the demolition works are complete a parcel of land will be handed over to AFC Wimbledon to build the Stadium alongside Galliard, who will build the residential part of the development.

# WHAT'S HAPPENING ON SITE

The contractors 777 have set-up site cabins and welfare facilities and carried out some initial enabling works.

Over the next couple of weeks they will be undertaking soft-strip, removing roof sheets and starting the careful dismantling of the existing buildings. There will also be some further site investigation surveys being carried out, so you may see some people digging and measuring.

AFC Wimbledon are the resurrection of Wimbledon's football club, reborn in 2002 when the football authorities allowed the owners of "Wimbledon FC" to relocate to Milton Keynes and become a Milton Keynes club.

Born in 1889 as Wimbledon Old Centrals and subsequently known as Wimbledon Borough, Wimbledon FC played on Plough Lane, initially on the same site as the new stadium under construction, before moving to a ground at the western end of the road from 1912 to 1991.
